Joshua J. Yates is Research Assistant Professor of Sociology at the University of Virginia and Director of the Program on Culture, Capitalism, and Global Change at the Institute of Advanced Studies in Culture.

Professor Yates is a cultural sociologist whose research focuses on three overlapping themes: the changing moral foundations of economic life, the development and institutionalization of a rudimentary global culture, and the conflicts and dilemmas such processes are generating both at home and across the world. He has written on the ethical imperatives of international humanitarianism and human rights organizations, the cultural significance of the anti-globalization/global justice movement, the challenges of a globalizing modernity to religion, and the cosmopolitanism of American global elites.

He is the lead editor of the forthcoming collection: *Thrift and Thriving in America: Capitalism and Moral Order from the Puritans to the Present* (Oxford University Press, 2011). He is also currently working on a book encapsulating the three principal themes of his research entitled: "The Problem of the Good World: Reflections on Globalization and Ethical Life."
